

**Senior missionaries assist in the gathering of Israel as they serve away from home, typically in 12, 18, or 23-month assignments.**

<b>Mission Types</b>	<b>6,500 positions are available. Members in good or excellent health are particularly needed in international locations.</b>
<b>Mission Office</b>	Assist mission leaders in the coordination of important roles within a mission – office, financial, housing, or vehicle coordination.
<b>Member and Leader Support</b>	Help wards and stakes fulfill the Church’s divinely appointed responsibilities of living the gospel of Jesus Christ, caring for those in need, inviting all to receive the gospel, and uniting families for eternity.
<b>Church Communications</b>	Assist local leaderships in providing information about the Church to the media, opinion leaders, interfaith groups, and the public.
<b>Church Headquarters</b>	Greet and assist patrons of the Family History Library or Church History Library, or serve in other locations supporting the Church.
<b>Visitors’ Centers and Historic Sites</b>	Share the gospel of Jesus Christ and the history of His Church through interactive exhibits and historic sites. Conduct tours and work with local ward councils to invite people to come to the site.
<b>Record Preservation</b>	Preserve family history records at churches, county courthouses, state archives, or national archives through capturing digital images.
<b>Welfare &amp; Humanitarian Aid</b>	Develop relationships with government, community, and charity organization leaders to coordinate critical local humanitarian needs.
<b>Area Offices</b>	Support an Area Presidency in administering the Church in an area. Opportunities include financial, technical or legal services.
<b>Missionary Medical</b>	Serve as an adviser to assist in managing the health of missionaries, coordinating care, and teaching preventive and self-care measures.
<b>Temple</b>	Serve for as a missionary at a location that does not have enough local temple ordinance workers. Assist temple patrons by serving as an ordinance worker or in other temple functions.

**Senior service missionaries serve from their home or in their local community.**

<b>Senior Service Missionary options currently available in Utah</b>	
<b>Church Headquarters</b>	Hundreds of service missionaries serve at the Family and Church History Libraries or with other Church Departments
<b>Inner City Mission</b>	Hundreds of service missionaries strengthen branches and wards in locations in Salt Lake and Ogden.
<b>Family History facilities</b>	Service missionaries assist patrons at FamilySearch Libraries in several locations through Utah (Lehi, Riverton, Layton, St. George, Ogden..)
<b>Family History (virtual)</b>	Service missionaries assist with providing customer service support and / or through online record preparation from their homes
<b>Temples</b>	Temples all throughout Utah welcome service missionaries as they assist in non-ordinance assignments; Custodian, Office, Grounds, Laundry, Organist
<b>Employment Centers</b>	Service missionaries assist patrons in 15+ Utah locations with their job search and other employment resources
<b>Mission Offices</b>	Service missionaries assist Utah missions by providing needed administrative support
<b>Bishop Storehouses</b>	Service missionaries assist patrons with providing food for those in need
<b>Home Store Centers</b>	Service missionaries assist patrons with building up the 1-year supply of food storage
<b>Addiction Recovery Program</b>	Service missionaries facilitate group classes assisting those healing from addiction
<b>BYU Pathway</b>	Service missionaries facilitate a weekly class of global students who are enrolled in the online BYU Pathway curriculum.
<b>Welfare Square</b>	Service missionaries in the Salt Lake area serve in the Bakery, Cannery and Dairy plant
<b>Beehive Clothing</b>	Service missionaries sew temple clothing in West Valley and American Fork
<b>Church Camps</b>	Service missionaries manage camps, equipment and property
<b>Production Facilities</b>	Service missionaries help produce a variety of food products.
<b>Church Education</b>	Service missionaries serve in seminaries and institutes.
<b>Distribution Centers</b>	Service missionaries assist patrons with Church supplies and resources including Temple clothing
